Strategic Plan for Ensuring Whole Child Student Success

The **54 Promise** is a multi-year strategic plan to guide District 54's core work of ensuring whole-child student success. This document was the result of the collaborative efforts of the District 54 Strategic Planning Committee which consisted of 74 participants representing teachers, administrators, parents and community members from across our system. The Strategic Planning Committee arrived at consensus around the **54 Promise** through a series of informative meeting sessions where input from all stakeholders was solicited. The **54 Promise** provides the entire District 54 community around the key district goals and operating priorities that will drive our system ahead in the years to come.

District 54 Goals

- District 54 will ensure the *success of the whole child* by providing comprehensive approaches and programming, grounded in the belief that each child deserves to be Healthy, Safe, Engaged, Supported and Challenged.
- District 54 will perform in the **top 10%** of all schools in reading and math growth and proficiency as measured by state and local assessments.
- District 54 will **close the** *achievement gap* for ALL students in reading and math as measured by state and local assessments.

Priority Action Steps

- Utilize Professional Learning Communities and professional development for ongoing improvement of instructional practices and school culture.

- Maintain fiscal responsibility that ensures District 54 sustains long-term financial stability.
- Develop a long-term facilities plan that ensures safety, accommodates for increasing enrollment and provides for 21st Century Learning modifications.

Your School Day...

Students enter the building at 7:30, go to their locker and report to first period by 7:40.

- Classes are approximately 40 minutes in length with a 3 minute passing period.
- ► Lunch is 20 minutes in length.
- School ends at 2:15 (Wednesday at 1:45)



Wednesday Advisory Class

- Advisory is a class that your child will attend from 7:40-8:00 AM only on Wednesdays.
- During Advisory, attendance is taken and morning announcements are provided.
- It is during this time that staff will have the opportunity to provide lessons focusing on the District 54 Social Emotional Learning standards.
- This time will also be used to check-in with students on their academic progress prior to conferences.



Electives

Every effort will be made to honor your child's request, <u>HOWEVER ELECTIVES ARE NOT A</u> <u>GUARANTEE.</u>

MAP scores are reviewed throughout the school year. Students who score in the 40th percentile or below in MAP math and/or reading will be assigned math and/or reading acceleration course in lieu of an elective.

Math and Reading Acceleration

- Timely intervention to support students in math and literacy
- Built into the school day
- Delivered as an "extra dose" on top of high quality instruction.
- Aligned to the needs of the student
- Aligned to the standard(s) being taught within initial instruction.
- MAP scores and previous performance (trend)

Math & Reading Acceleration in the Junior High

- Purpose of Math and Reading Acceleration: To provide additional support to students in math and reading in an effort to *accelerate* your learning to grade level and beyond.
 a. This is no different than in elementary school.
- 2. MAP scores are reviewed throughout the year.
 - a. Students who score below grade level, in the 40th percentile or below, in MAP math and/or reading will be assigned math and/or reading acceleration in place of an elective.
- 3. For students that need additional support in math and reading based on course performance, will be enrolled in Math or Reading Acceleration in place of one or both electives.
 - a. Student academic progress is discussed on a consistent basis throughout each trimester.
 - b. Bottom Line: if you need the academic support, we will not wait! We will get you the support that is needed for you to be successful in math and reading.

Bottom Line: We will do whatever it takes, and what is necessary, to support you to be as prepared as possible and ready to MAXIMIZE all of your opportunities that await you in high school.

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Electives and Scheduling

- 1. Priority when scheduling is ensuring that you are placed in the appropriate core content subject classes (language arts, mathematics, social studies, science, and PE/health).
- 2. Once those classes are scheduled, every effort will be made to honor your elective requests. However, due to priority scheduling placed on core content class placement, we cannot guarantee that you will get both electives you have requested.
